## APPROVING BUDGET MODIFICATION FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2000 OPERATING BUDGET FOR THE LITTLE RIVER CASINO RESORT (RESORT) TO REFLECT A 2000 BUDGET AMENDMENT OF \$50,000.00 TO INCREASE PTO DAYS EARNED BY EMPLOYEES IN 2<sup>ND</sup> YEAR OF EMPLOYMENT FROM 15 TO 18 DAYS.

WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians is a federally recognized tribe, as reafffirmed under PL 103-324 enacted on September 21, 1994 with property rights secured to it under the 1836 Treaty of Washington (7 Stat.491) and the 1855 Treaty of Detroit (11 Stat. 621); and

WHEREAS, the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians (Tribe) is the owner of the Little River Casino Resort; and

WHEREAS, the enterprise has expressed concern for the disparity of benefits of Little River Casino Resort employees and the benefits of the competition; and

WHEREAS, it is anticipated that increases in employee benefits will be helpful in the recruitment and retention of enterprise employees; and

WHEREAS, the Little River Casino Resort developed the above indicated employee benefit to partially address these issues; and

WHEREAS, the Business Board of the Little River Casino Resort has reviewed and approved the increase in PTO days in the 2<sup>nd</sup> year of employment from 15 to 18 days.

NOW THEREFORE IT IS RESOLVED THAT the Tribal Council of the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians hereby approves of the increase of PTO days from 15 to 18 in the second year of employment effective July 1, 2000 and the necessary budget amendment associated with this change in Little River Casino Resort employee benefits.
