RESOLUTION NO. 01-05-30-01

COMMUNITY SERVICES BLOCK GRANT APPLICATION

- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians has a long and proud history as a Nation which pre-dates the establishment of the government of the United States of America, and
- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians was a signatory of the Treaty of Washington of March 28, 1836 and the Treaty of Detroit of July 31, 1855 with the United States of America, and
- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians status as a federally-recognized Tribe was reaffirmed and restored by the United States Congress in Public Law 103-324, and
- WHEREAS, The State of Michigan Department of Civil Rights has funding for Community Services Block Grants to serve Native American people in Michigan including the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians, and
- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians has a need for assistance for our food commodity program and funding from a Community Services Block Grant may be used for this purpose, and
- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians Tribal Council wishes to apply for funds through the Community Services Block Grant to assist our commodity food program

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians by this resolution requests funds in the amount of \$22,082 for the Community Services Block Grant from the State of Michigan Department of Civil Rights to assist our Tribal Food Commodity Program.
