INDIAN HEALTH SERVICES SMALL AMBULATORY GRANT

WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians has a long and proud history as a Nation which pre-dates the establishment of the government of the United States of America, and

WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians was a signatory of the Treaty of Washington of March 28, 1836 and the Treaty of Detroit of July 31, 1855 with the United States of America, and

WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians status as a federally-recognized Tribe was reaffirmed and restored by the United States Congress in Public Law 103-324, and

WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians has identified a need to build a new health clinic to serve eligible Native Americans in need of health care, and

WHEREAS, The Indian Health Service has funding available that can be used for this Purpose in the Small Ambulatory Grant Program, and

WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians wishes to apply for funding to assist in this effort




CERTIFICATION OF ADOPTION
