## RESOLUTION NO. 01-07-25-03

## WATER RESOURCE MANAGEMENT AND PLANNING GRANT

- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians has a long and proud history as a Nation which pre-dates the establishment of the government of the United States of America, and
- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians was a signatory of the Treaty of Washington of March 28, 1836 and the Treaty of Detroit of July 31, 1855 with the United States of America, and
- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians status as a federally-recognized Tribe was reaffirmed and restored by the United States Congress in Public Law 103-324, and
- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians is deeply involved in protecting the environment in which we live in protecting the air, land and water quality of our area, and
- WHEREAS, The Little River Band is operating a Water Quality Grant from the EPA to study the water quality of the Manistee River Watershed, and
- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians wishes to apply for funding to The Bureau of Indian Affairs to assist in the area of Water Resource Management and Planning
- NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians by this resolution wishes to submit a grant proposal to the Bureau of Indian Affairs for a Water Resource Management and Planning Grant in the amount of \$20,000
