USDA RURAL DEVELOPMENT COMMUNITY FACILITIES GRANT


- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians has a long and proud history as a Nation which pre-dates the establishment of the government of the United States of America, and
- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians was a signatory of the Treaty of Washington of March 28, 1836 and the Treaty of Detroit of July 31, 1855 with the United States of America, and
- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians status as a federally-recognized Tribe was reaffirmed and restored by the United States Congress in Public Law 103-324, and
- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians is developing housing for Tribal Elders at our Aki Waadi Zi Win housing project and those Elders will be in need of transportation and,
- WHEREAS, The Housing Commission and the Housing Staff are also in need of a vehicle to assist in housing business and,
- WHEREAS, The USDA has funding available in the Rural Development Community Facilities Grant that can be used to meet this need
- NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians by this resolution wishes to submit a grant proposal to the USDA for a USDA Rural Development Grant in the amount of \$24,000 and the Tribe will match this grant with \$8,000 toward the purchase of a \$32,000 minivan for the Little River Band Housing Department.
