- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians is a member Tribe of the Chippewa Ottawa Resource Authority (CORA) and,
- WHEREAS, The Chippewa Ottawa Resource Authority (CORA) has a need to establish and develop a strategic plan

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians by this resolution supports the efforts of the Chippewa Ottawa Resource Authority (CORA) to obtain funding from the Administration for Native Americans to develop and establish a strategic plan.
