RESOLUTION NO. 01-11-07-0

STOP VIOLENCE AGAINST INDIAN WOMEN DISCRETIONARY GRANT

- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians has a long and proud history as a Nation which pre-dates the establishment of the government of the United States of America, and
- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians was a signatory of the Treaty of Washington of March 28, 1836 and the Treaty of Detroit of July 31, 1855 with the United States of America, and
- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians status as a federally-recognized Tribe was reaffirmed and restored by the United States Congress in Public Law 103-324, and
- WHEREAS, The culture of the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians provides for a high level of respect for all women, and the protection of the women of the Little River Band is a priority for the Tribe, and
- WHEREAS, The U.S. Department of Justice has funding available for grants under the STOP Violence Against Indian Women Discretionary Grant Program

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that by this resolution the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians Tribal Council authorizes the submission of a grant to the U.S. Department of Justice in the amount of \$50,000 to participate in the STOP Violence Against Indian Women Discretionary Grant Program.
