CIRCLE OF FLIGHT GRANT

- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians has a long and proud history as a Nation which pre-dates the establishment of the government of the United States of America, and
- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians was a signatory of the Treaty of Washington of March 28, 1836 and the Treaty of Detroit of July 31, 1855 with the United States of America, and
- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians status as a federally-recognized Tribe was reaffirmed and restored by the United States Congress in Public Law 103-324, and
- WHEREAS, The Bureau of Indian Affairs has funding available to assist the Tribe in protection of Tribal wetlands through the Circle of Flight Wetland and Waterfowl Initiative, and
- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians has participated in the Circle of Flight program for the past three years and wishes to participate in the program for a fourth year, and
- WHEREAS, This participation would allow the Tribe to complete a fourth year of monitoring of Peters Bayou and the Bayous of the Manistee River corridor within the 1836 LRBOI Reservation

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians by this resolution wishes to submit a grant proposal to the Bureau of Indian Affairs for participation in the Circle of Flight Program for 2002
