- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians has a long and proud history as a Nation which pre-dates the establishment of the government of the United States of America, and
- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians was a signatory of the Treaty of Washington of March 28, 1836 and the Treaty of Detroit of July 31, 1855 with the United States of America, and
- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians status as a federally-recognized Tribe was reaffirmed and restored by the United States Congress in Public Law 103-324, and
- WHEREAS, The Bureau of Indian Affairs has funding available to assist the Tribe in protection of Tribal wetlands through the Noxious Weed Project funding, and
- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians has a need to fight a noxious weed called Purple Loosestrife through raising special beetles in a Tribal greenhouse

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians by this resolution wishes to submit a grant proposal to the Bureau of Indian Affairs for participation in the Noxious Weed Project Grant Program for 2002
