NOXIOUS WEED GRANT

WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians has a long and proud history as a Nation which pre-dates the establishment of the government of the United States of America, and

WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians was a signatory of the Treaty of Washington of March 28, 1836 and the Treaty of Detroit of July 31, 1855 with the United States of America, and

WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians status as a federally-recognized Tribe was reaffirmed and restored by the United States Congress in Public Law 103-324, and


WHEREAS, The Bureau of Indian Affairs has funding available to assist the Tribe in protection of Tribal wetlands through the Noxious Weed Project funding, and

WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians has a need to fight a noxious weed called Purple Loosestrife through raising special beetles in a Tribal greenhouse


