BROWNFIELD'S GRANT

- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians has a long and proud history as a Nation which pre-dates the establishment of the government of the United States of America, and
- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians was a signatory of the Treaty of Washington of March 28, 1836 and the Treaty of Detroit of July 31, 1855 with the United States of America, and
- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians status as a federally-recognized Tribe was reaffirmed and restored by the United States Congress in Public Law 103-324, and
- WHEREAS, The lands of the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians has not always been under the control of our people, and
- WHEREAS, There is concern that some Tribal lands may have not been treated properly over the past 100 years which may have resulted in pollution possibilities that may need to be addressed by the Tribe, and
- WHEREAS, The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency has funding available to assist the Tribe with Brownfield's Assessment

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians by This resolution wishes to submit a grant in the amount of \$200,000 to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency to conduct Brownfield Assessment on Tribal Lands.
