- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians was a signatory of the Treaty of Washington of March 28, 1836 and the Treaty of Detroit of July 31, 1855 with the United States of America, and
- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians status as a federally-recognized Tribe was reaffirmed and restored by the United States Congress in Public Law 103-324, and
- WHEREAS, The culture of the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians provides for a high level of respect for all people and has a special respect for families, and
- WHEREAS, The Department of Health and Human Services Administration for Children and Families has funding available for program services to assist families in crisis from family violence

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that by this resolution the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians Tribal Council authorizes the submission of a grant to the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services Administration for Children and Families for a grant to provide for a Family Violence Prevention Services Program.
