SPECIAL DIABETES PROGRAM GRANT FOR INDIANS

- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians has a long and proud history as a Nation which pre-dates the establishment of the government of the United States of America, and
- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians was a signatory of the Treaty of Washington of March 28, 1836 and the Treaty of Detroit of July 31, 1855 with the United States of America, and
- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians status as a federally-recognized Tribe was reaffirmed and restored by the United States Congress in Public Law 103-324, and
- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians has identified health as a priority for the Tribe, and
- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians has identified Tribal members who suffer from Diabetes and need assistance to learn to live with this disease, and
- WHEREAS, The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services Indian Health Services has funding available for Special Diabetes Program Grants for Indians

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that by this resolution the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians Tribal Council authorizes the submission of a grant to the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Indian Health Service in the amount of \$80,122.00 for a Special Diabetes Program Grant for Indians.
