INDIAN HEALTH SERVICE SELF-GOVERNANCE PLANNING GRANT

- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians has a long and proud history as a Nation which pre-dates the establishment of the government of the United States of America, and
- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians was a signatory of the Treaty of Washington of March 28, 1836 and the Treaty of Detroit of July 31, 1855 with the United States of America, and
- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians status as a federally-recognized Tribe was reaffirmed and restored by the United States Congress in Public Law 103-324, and
- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians has established a strong government and is developing strong internal systems, and
- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians wishes to prepare Tribal systems for operation under Self-Governance with the Indian Health Service by applying for a Self-Governance planning grant, and
- WHEREAS, The Indian Health Service has funding available to assist Tribes in Self-Governance planning through Self-Governance Planning Grants

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians by this resolution authorizes submission of a Self-Governance Planning Grant in the amount of \$50,000 to the Indian Health Service.
