**Resolution # 02-0306-** 09

Amending and Clarifying the Extent of Background Checks Regarding Membership in the Gaming Commission

- WHEREAS, the Tribe's status as a federally-recognized Indian tribe was reaffirmed and restored by Congress pursuant to Public Law 103-324, 108 Stat. 2156 (25 U.S.C. §1300k et seq.); and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted a new Constitution, pursuant to a vote of the membership on May 27, 1998, which Constitution became effective upon its approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on July 10, 1998; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is authorized under Article IV, Section 7(f) to create regulatory commissions with the power to manage the affairs and enterprises of the Tribe; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has adopted the <u>Gaming Ordinance</u>, # 97-400-01, which creates a Gaming Commission to regulate and provide oversight of the gaming operations; and
- WHEREAS, Gaming Commissions must have a background investigation as well as identification of conflicts of interest which include employment within the gaming operations, *Gaming Ordinance*, sec. 4.04 and 4.05; and
- WHEREAS, the qualifications for being a member of the Gaming Commission are unclear and require Tribal Council action clarifying the extent of the background investigation and prohibited conduct; and
- WHEREAS, the Gaming Commission now has three vacancies resulting from recent resignations and completion of terms of office; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Ogema and Tribal Council have been unable to identify applicants and ratify appointments for members on the Gaming Commission in sufficient numbers and with speed to fill the membership of the Gaming Commission in order for it to meet; and
- WHEREAS, it is important that the Gaming Commission meet in order to make licensing decisions, review activities presented by the Surveillance Department, licensing applications, as well as audits and other reports regarding the gaming operations; and
- WHEREAS, recognizing the importance of the activities of the Gaming Commission, the Tribal Council has determined that it is necessary to re-establish a quorum for the Gaming Commission by taking emergency actions to provide for a short term correction which

allows for a long term decision to be made in a reasonable and time manner;

NOW THEREFORE IT IS RESOLVED THAT the Tribal Council of the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians hereby amends section 4.04 of the <u>Gaming Ordinance</u>, to conform with the time lines set forth in section 13.06, or equivalent time lines when applicable;

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the Tribal Council hereby adopts this emergency action for six months during which time long term solutions shall be crafted and presented.
