WATER QUALITY MANAGEMENT GRANT

WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians has a long and proud history as a Nation which pre-dates the establishment of the government of the United States of America, and

WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians was a signatory of the Treaty of Washington of March 28, 1836 and the Treaty of Detroit of July 31, 1855 with the United States of America, and

WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians status as a federally-recognized Tribe was reaffirmed and restored by the United States Congress in Public Law 103-324, and


WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians has a responsibility to protect the waters of our reservation, and

WHEREAS, The Environmental Protection Agency has funding available for testing and collecting data on the water quality on the lakes, rivers, and streams of the reservation

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians by this resolution wishes to submit a grant to the Environmental Protection Agency for a water quality management program for 2003 and 2004.


CERTIFICATION OF ADOPTION
