## Sea Lamprey Assessment Contract

- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians has a long and proud history as a Nation which pre-dates the establishment of the government of the United States of America, and
- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians was a signatory of the Treaty of Washington of March 28, 1836 and the Treaty of Detroit of July 31, 1855 with the United States of America, and
- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians status as a federally-recognized Tribe was reaffirmed and restored by the United States Congress in Public Law 103-324, and
- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians has worked with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service in the past on the control of the Sea Lamprey which endangers our fish stocks, and
- WHEREAS, The U.S. Fish and Wildlife again wishes to enter into a contractual agreement with the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians for assistance in the control of the Sea Lamprey in the Little Manistee River, and
- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians wishes to accept and enter into a contract with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife for funding to assist in the control of the Sea Lamprey in the waters of the Little Manistee River
- NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians by this resolution wishes to request a contract from the U.S. Fish and Wildlife for the control of the Sea Lamprey on the waters of the Little Manistee River.
