Roads Capacity Building Grant

- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians has a long and proud history as a Nation which pre-dates the establishment of the government of the United States of America, and
- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians was a signatory to the Treaty of Washington of March 28, 1836 and the Treaty of Detroit of July 31, 1855 with the United States of America, and
- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians status as a federally-recognized.

 Tribe was reaffirmed and restored by the United States Congress in Public Law 103-324, and
- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians has a need for a Tribal Road system with funding support from the Bureau of Indian Affairs, and
- WHEREAS, The Bureau of Indian Affairs has funding available for Tribal roads assistance, and
- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians wishes to apply for funds from the FY 2002 Indian Reservation Roads Program.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians by this resolution wishes to request funding in the amount of \$35,000 from the FY 2002 Indian Reservation Roads Program to assist the Tribe with our roads.
