
**GREAT LAKES STURGEON RESEARCH AND
REHABILITATION PROJECT GRANT**

- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians has a long and proud history as a Nation which pre-dates the establishment of the government of the United States of America, and
- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians was a signatory of the Treaty of Washington of March 28, 1836 and the Treaty of Detroit of July 31, 1855 with the United States of America, and
- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians status as a federally-recognized Tribe was reaffirmed and restored by the United States Congress in Public Law 103-324, and
- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians is concerned about the Great Lakes Sturgeon and their small numbers spawning in the Manistee River, and
- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians wishes to conduct a study on the Lake Sturgeon in the Manistee River over a three year period by monitoring Lake Sturgeon egg deposition, larval drift, young-of-the year dispersal and habitat utilization

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that by this resolution the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians Tribal Council authorizes the submission of a grant to the Great Lakes Fishery Trust in the amount of \$77,655 for a Great Lakes Sturgeon Research and Rehabilitation Project.

CERTIFICATION OF ADOPTION
