RESOLUTION NO. 02-0508-02 ROADS INVENTORY AND CURRENT ROADS CONSTRUCTION PRIORITY LIST

- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians has a long and proud history as a Nation which pre-dates the establishment of the government of the United States of America, and
- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians was a signatory of the Treaty of Washington of March 28, 1836 and the Treaty of Detroit of July 31, 1855 with the United States of America, and
- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians status as a federally-recognized Tribe was reaffirmed and restored by the United States Congress in Public Law 103-324, and
- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians has a need for a Tribal Road system with funding support from the Bureau of Indian Affairs, and
- WHEREAS, The Bureau of Indian Affairs has established a Indian Reservation Roads Inventory and Construction Priority List, and
- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians wishes to submit an Indian Reservation Roads Inventory and Construction Priority List to establish the road needs for our Tribe

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians Tribal Council by this resolution wishes to submit our Indian Reservation Roads Inventory and Construction Priority List
