RESOLUTION NO. 02-0515- 02

COPS TRIBAL RESOURCES GRANT

- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians has a long and proud history as a Nation which pre-dates the establishment of the government of the United States of America, and
- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians was a signatory of the Treaty of Washington of March 28, 1836 and the Treaty of Detroit of July 31, 1855 with the United States of America, and
- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians status as a federally-recognized Tribe was reaffirmed and restored by the United States Congress in Public Law 103-324, and
- WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians Public Safety Department is in need of specialized equipment and training which can be provided through a grant with the U.S. Department of Justice under the Violent Crime Control And Law Enforcement Act of 1994

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that by this resolution the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians Tribal Council authorizes the submission of a grant to the United States Department of Justice for a COPS Tribal Resources Grant to purchase equipment and training for the Tribe's Public Safety Department with a grant of \$118,609 with a Tribal Cash Match of \$39,609 for a total project of \$158,435.
