Adoption of the Little River Casino Resort's Disposal of Assets Policy

WHEREAS, the Band's status as a federally-recognized Indian tribe was reaffirmed and restored by Congress pursuant to Public Law 103-324, 108 Stat. 2156 (25 U.S.C. §1300k et seq.); and

WHEREAS, the Band adopted a Constitution, pursuant to a vote of the membership on May 27, 1998, which Constitution became effective upon its approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on July 10, 1998; and

WHEREAS, the Tribe is entitled to the protections and benefits accorded federally-recognized Indian tribes under federal law, including those under the Indian Gaming Regulatory Act of 1988 (25 U.S.C. §2701 et seq.)(hereinafter "IGRA"), which permits Indian tribes to operate Class II gaming activities on lands held in trust for the Tribe; and

WHEREAS, the Tribe has, since July 1999, conducted Class III gaming operations on its Reservation at an interim gaming facility, known as "Little River Casino Resort"; and


WHEREAS, the Business Board of Little River Casino Resort ("Resort"), on December 2, 2002, approved the Resort's Disposal of Assets Policy; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has determined that the Resort's Disposal of Assets Policy should be adopted.

NOW THEREFORE IT IS RESOLVED THAT the Tribal Council of the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians hereby approves and adopts the Disposal of Assets Policy.

CERTIFICATE OF ADOPTION
