## **Resolution # 03-0709-197**

Modification of Public Notice Requirements for the Gwiidookadaadimi for Fiscal Year 2001 Payments

- WHEREAS, the status of the *Gaá Čhing Ziibi Daáwaa Anišhinaábek* (Little River Band of Ottawa Indians) as a sovereign and Treaty-making power is confirmed in numerous treaties, from agreements with the initial colonial powers on this land, to various treaties with the United States; and
- WHEREAS, the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians (Tribe) is descended from, and is the political successor to, the Grand River Ottawa Bands, signatories of the 1836 Treaty of Washington (7 Stat. 491) with the United States, as reaffirmed by federal law in P.L. 103-324, enacted in 1994; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted a new Constitution, pursuant to a vote of the membership on May 27, 1998, which Constitution became effective upon its approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on July 10, 1998; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is authorized under Article IV, Section 7(a) to provide for the public health, peace, morals, education and general welfare of the Little River Band and its members; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council adopted resolution # 03-0212-38, Conclusion of Gwiidookadaadimi for Fiscal Year 2001 Payments, that finalized the payments to minors and missed adult members; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council adopted resolution # 03-0326-82, Conclusion of Gwiidookadaadimi for Fiscal Year 2001 Corrected, which corrected the disbursement dates; and
- WHEREAS, the above resolutions required the placement of a Public Notice in various newspapers in order to reach those remaining members to whom this payment is owed; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has identified that the cost of this type of action would exceed \$10,000 and would not effectively reach the membership; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has determined that placing the Public Notice in the Tribal newsletter and newspapers in Grand Rapids, Milwaukee and Chicago would place the notice in areas with large concentrations of members who would be able to notify any members listed;

NOW THEREFORE IT IS RESOLVED THAT the Tribal Council of the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians hereby modifies the Public Notice posting requirements set forth in resolution # 03-0212-82 to require Public Notices to be placed in appropriate newspapers in Chicago, Illinois; Milwaukee, Wisconsin; and Grand Rapids, Michigan.
