Amendment of Contract with William Brooks to Reflect Organizational Changes that Assign the Attorney and Reporting Responsibilities to the Tribal Council

- WHEREAS, the status of the *Gaá Čhíng Ziibi Daáwaa Anišhinaábek* (Little River Band of Ottawa Indians) as a sovereign and Treaty-making power is confirmed in numerous treaties, from agreements with the initial colonial powers on this land, to various treaties with the United States; and
- WHEREAS, the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians (Tribe) is descended from, and is the political successor to, the Grand River Ottawa Bands, signatories of the 1836 Treaty of Washington (7 Stat. 491) with the United States, as reaffirmed by federal law in P.L. 103-324, enacted in 1994; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted a new Constitution, pursuant to a vote of the membership on May 27, 1998, which Constitution became effective upon its approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on July 10, 1998; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is authorized under Article IV, Section 7(a) to provide for the public health, peace, morals, education and general welfare of the Little River Band and its members; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council approved an employment contract with William Brooks for legal services to be provided to the Tribe by resolution # 03-0528-145; and
- WHEREAS, the Ogema has requested clarification of reporting and supervision responsibilities regarding legal counsel employed by the Tribe and the Tribal Council agrees that this clarification is needed in order to improve the communications and services provided by the legal counsel employed by the Tribe; and
- WHEREAS, the Ogema has submitted an amendment to the contract entered into with William Brooks which clarifies the reporting and supervision responsibilities to the Trial Council;

NOW THEREFORE IT IS RESOLVED THAT the Tribal Council of the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians hereby authorizes the Ogema to enter into the amendment to the contract with William Brooks for the purposes of clarification of reporting and supervision responsibilities, all other matters in the original contract to remain unchanged.

CERTIFICATE OF ADOPTION

Amendment to Contract Between the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians and William Brooks To Correct and Assign Reporting and Supervision Responsibilities to the Tribal Council

This amendment entered into between Lee A. Sprague, Ogema, and William Brooks, Attorney, amends the contract approved by the Tribal Council by resolution # 03-0528-145.

The purpose of this amendment is to clarify and correct, as necessary, reporting and supervision of Attorney Brooks. No other provisions of the prior contract are amended by this agreement.

- 1. Attorney Brooks is assigned to the Tribal Council and shall take direction and supervision from the Tribal Council.
- 2. The Tribal Council is the primary supervisor of the Attorney from whom direction and assignments shall be delivered to Attorney.
- 3. The Tribal Council shall notify Attorney Brooks if changes regarding assignment of the primary supervisor are made.
- 4. The Tribal Council shall identify the budgeting for the Attorney and related expenses as needed in the annual budget. Such budget may be separate or included with the budget of the Tribal Council.
- 5. Attorney Brooks shall receive performance evaluations from the Tribal Council, and the primary supervisor and Attorney shall meet to discuss such evaluations.
- 6. Nothing in this agreement shall authorize the primary supervisor individually to make employment related decisions such as negotiation of contract amendments, terminations, or extensions without written authorization by the Tribal Council. All amendments, terminations or extensions to the Attorney's contract shall be made by resolution of the Tribal Council.
