Resolution # 03-0820-264

Authorizing the Tribal Ogema, or in the Absence of, the Tribal Council Speaker to Execute an Engagement Letter with Drummond, Woodsum & MacMahon for Services in Connection with Preparation of a Legal Memorandum on Federal Employment Laws

- WHEREAS, the status of the *Gaá Čhíng Ziibi Daáwaa Anišhinaábek* (Little River Band of Ottawa Indians) as a sovereign and Treaty-making power is confirmed in numerous treaties, from agreements with the initial colonial powers on this land, to various treaties with the United States; and
- WHEREAS, the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians (Tribe) is descended from, and is the political successor to, the Grand River Ottawa Bands, signatories of the 1836 Treaty of Washington (7 Stat. 491) with the United States, as reaffirmed by federal law in P.L. 103-324, enacted in 1994; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted a new Constitution, pursuant to a vote of the membership on May 27, 1998, which Constitution became effective upon its approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on July 10, 1998; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is authorized under Article IV, Section 7(a) to provide for the public health, peace, morals, education and general welfare of the Little River Band and its members; and
- WHEREAS, pursuant to Article IV, Section 5 (a)(4) and Article V, Section 5(a)(3) and (8) of the Tribal Constitution, the Tribal Ogema, or in the absence of, the Tribal Council Speaker, is authorized to represent the Band in its relations with other organizations and manage the economic affairs/enterprises of the Triba, in a manner consistent with the Tribal Constitution and resolutions of the Tribal Council; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council, pursuant to Article IV, Section 7 (b) of the Constitution, has the power to authorize and ratify agreements and contracts negotiated by the Tribal Ogema; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has, pursuant to Resolution #02-0109-05, retained the law firm of Drummond, Woodsum & MacMahon as Special Counsel to Band for various projects related to economic development activities of the Band; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council Speaker has, in consultation with the Legal Department, presented an engagement letter to add services to assist the Band with evaluation of the legal issues associated with the application of federal employment laws to assist the Band in making policy decisions concerning adoption of Tribal employment ordinances.

NOW THEREFORE IT IS RESOLVED THAT the Tribal Council of the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians hereby authorizes the Tribal Ogema, or in the absence of, the Tribal Council Speaker to execute an Engagement Letter with the law firm of Drummond, Woodsum & MacMahon for services related to preparation of a legal memorandum outlining the application of federal employment laws to Indian tribes and Tribally-owned business enterprises.
