## **Resolution # 03-0910-300**

Authorizing the Tribal Ogema to Execute a Microsoft Open License Value Agreement with MSLI, GP (Microsoft)

- WHEREAS, the status of the *Gaá Čhíng Ziíbi Daáwaa Aníšhinaábek* (Little River Band of Ottawa Indians) as a sovereign and Treaty-making power is confirmed in numerous treaties, from agreements with the initial colonial powers on this land, to various treaties with the United States; and
- WHEREAS, the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians (Tribe) is descended from, and is the political successor to, the Grand River Ottawa Bands, signatories of the 1836 Treaty of Washington (7 Stat. 491) with the United States, as reaffirmed by federal law in P.L. 103-324, enacted in 1994; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted a new Constitution, pursuant to a vote of the membership on May 27, 1998, which Constitution became effective upon its approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on July 10, 1998; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is authorized under Article IV, Section 7(a) to provide for the public health, peace, morals, education and general welfare of the Little River Band and its members; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council created a Business Board and delegated authority to make business decisions on behalf of the Tribe's gaming enterprises during the term of the Management Agreement; and
- WHEREAS, the Business Board of Little River Casino Resort ("Resort") approved the Microsoft Open License Value Agreement ("Agreement") with MSLI, GP on September 2, 2003; and
- WHEREAS, the Agreement requires the Tribe to agree to application of the laws of the State of Washington and the federal laws of the United States which, as a result of federal, state, and U.S. Supreme Court decisions have left open the question of implied waivers of sovereign immunity within contracts unless specifically denied; and
- WHEREAS, the Constitution requires the Tribal Council to adopt a resolution specifically waiving sovereign immunity of the Tribe; and

WHEREAS, the Agreement does not require the Tribe to waive sovereign immunity and the Tribal Council does not desire to do so, but does agree to the application of the laws of the State of Washington and the federal laws of the United States.

NOW THEREFORE IT IS RESOLVED THAT the Tribal Council of the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians hereby approves the Agreement and authorizes the Tribal Ogema to sign such agreement.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the Tribal Council hereby does not waive the sovereign immunity of the Tribe by acceptance of the application of the laws of the State of Washington and the federal laws of the United States and does not interpret the application of the laws of Washington and the federal laws of the United States as having accepted or approved such waiver of sovereign immunity.
