Amendment of Government Operations Personnel Manual to Clarify Drafting Errors and to Lengthen Time for Grievance Review and Response

- WHEREAS, the status of the *Gaá Čhíng Ziíbi Daáwaa Anišhinaábek* (Little River Band of Ottawa Indians) as a sovereign and Treaty-making power is confirmed in numerous treaties, from agreements with the initial colonial powers on this land, to various treaties with the United States; and
- WHEREAS, the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians (Tribe) is descended from, and is the political successor to, the Grand River Ottawa Bands, signatories of the 1836 Treaty of Washington (7 Stat. 491) with the United States, as reaffirmed by federal law in P.L. 103-324, enacted in 1994; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted a new Constitution, pursuant to a vote of the membership on May 27, 1998, which Constitution became effective upon its approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on July 10, 1998; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is authorized under Article IV, Section 7(a) to provide for the public health, peace, morals, education and general welfare of the Little River Band and its members; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council requested a review and amendment of the 1998 Personnel Manual to clarify the amendments that had taken place between its adoption and today, and to request clarification of the position of 'Tribal Manager' as present in that document; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council was presented the Government Operations Personnel Manual (Personnel Manual) which incorporated the amendments adopted by the Tribal Council between 1998 and the present, and clarified application of the position 'Tribal Manager' as well as other minor changes which was reauthorized by the Tribal Council on August 8, 2002; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has authorized engagement of a consultant to conduct a complete review of the Tribe's employment policies and processes and to submit a new Personnel Manual and Human Resources Procedures; and

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WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has determined that there are errors in the re-authorized Personnel Manual which require amendment by the Tribal Council prior to the completion of the review of the Tribe's employment policies and processes; and

NOW THEREFORE IT IS RESOLVED THAT the Tribal Council of the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians hereby amends Sections 8.4 and 8.6 of the Government Operations Personnel Manual as follows.

- 8.4. Representation. The employee may elect to have legal counsel, at his/her own expense, at the hearing before the Tribal Court during the grievance process.
- **8.6.** Settlement of Grievance. Any and all grievances resolved at any step of the grievance procedure as contained in this policy will not be final and binding on the Tribe, the employee and any and all employees involved in the particular grievance until agreed to by the aggrieved party or decided finally by the Tribal Court Ogema.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the Tribal Council hereby amends "Chapter VIII. Grievance Procedure" to change references to a three day response period to a grievance to a ten day response period to a grievance as set forth in section 8.3(a) and (b).

CERTIFICATE OF ADOPTION
