Resolution # 04-0310-108

Ratification of MITN Operator Agreement and Authorization to Enter Into Such Agreement by the Ogema through Public Safety Officers

- WHEREAS, the status of the *Gaá Čhíng Ziíbi Daáwaa Aníšhinaábek* (Little River Band of Ottawa Indians) as a sovereign and Treaty-making power is confirmed in numerous treaties, from agreements with the initial colonial powers on this land, to various treaties with the United States; and
- WHEREAS, the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians (Tribe) is descended from, and is the political successor to, the Grand River Ottawa Bands, signatories of the 1836 Treaty of Washington (7 Stat. 491) with the United States, as reaffirmed by federal law in P.L. 103-324, enacted in 1994; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted a new Constitution, pursuant to a vote of the membership on May 27, 1998, which Constitution became effective upon its approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on July 10, 1998; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is authorized under Article IV, Section 7(a) to provide for the public health, peace, morals, education and general welfare of the Little River Band and its members; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is authorized under Article IV, Section 7(b) of the Constitution to ratify contracts and authorize the Ogema to enter into those contracts; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has been presented a contract with the Michigan Commission on Law Enforcement Standards (MCOLES) which allows access to information related to maintaining the appropriate certifications and training classes; and
- WHEREAS, the Ogema has identified that the MCOLES Information and Tracking Network (MITN) is necessary to assist individual Public Safety officers to maintain required employment qualifications; and

WHEREAS, the MITN Operator agreement contains language which authorizes certain sanctions in regards to mis-use of the MITN information, and/or violation of confidentiality agreements; and

WHEREAS, such sanctions involve termination of access to the network by individual Public Safety Officers or termination of the agency agreement;

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has determined that this is a necessary tool for the Public Safety Department and the officers;

NOW THEREFORE IT IS RESOLVED THAT the Tribal Council of the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians hereby ratifies the MCOLES Information and Tracking Network Operator Agreement and authorizes the Ogema to enter into that agreement.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the Tribal Council hereby states that no waiver of sovereign immunity by the Tribe is granted as a result of entering into this agreement and that this resolution shall accompany the agreement when it is submitted.
