Resolution # 04-0324-136

Authorizing Supplemental Appropriation in the Amount of \$6,000.00 for Professional Fees Associated with Joint Efforts to Pursue a Ballot Initiative to Prevent Expansion of Commercial Gaming in the State of Michigan

- WHEREAS, the status of the *Gaá Čhíng Ziíbi Daáwaa Aníšhinaábek* (Little River Band of Ottawa Indians) as a sovereign and Treaty-making power is confirmed in numerous treaties, from agreements with the initial colonial powers on this land, to various treaties with the United States; and
- WHEREAS, the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians (Tribe) is descended from, and is the political successor to, the Grand River Ottawa Bands, signatories of the 1836 Treaty of Washington (7 Stat. 491) with the United States, as reaffirmed by federal law in P.L. 103-324, enacted in 1994; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted a new Constitution, pursuant to a vote of the membership on May 27, 1998, which Constitution became effective upon its approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on July 10, 1998; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is authorized under Article IV, Section 7(a) to provide for the public health, peace, morals, education and general welfare of the Little River Band and its members; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe and the State of Michigan have entered into Gaming Compacts authorized under the Indian Gaming Regulatory Act; and
- WHEREAS, the terms of the Gaming Compacts include provisions designed to limit the expansion of Tribal and commercial gaming in the State by limiting the Tribes to one Class III gaming site and providing Tribal payments to the State as consideration for the State's agreement not to further expand commercial gaming activities outside the City of Detroit; and
- WHEREAS, the State of Michigan is now considering adoption of legislation that would allow racinos to be developed at racetracks located in Michigan whose purported economic benefit would be the agricultural industry and increased state revenues; and

- WHEREAS, the State of Michigan has considered other forms of legislation that would allow further expansion of commercial gaming in the State, including placement of video lottery machines or slot machines in restaurants and taverns; and
- WHEREAS, the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians shares the views of other constituent groups that further expansion of commercial gaming in the State of Michigan, including commercial casino gaming operated through the State Lottery, is not in the interest of the State; and
- WHEREAS, the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians also recognizes that authorizing expanded commercial gaming will have a significant negative impact on Tribal gaming operations which have substantial positive social and economic impacts for the both Tribal communities and the local communities near reservation-based Tribal gaming facilities; and
- WHEREAS, the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians recognizes that it must commit financial resources to participate in broad-based efforts to respond to efforts by various interest groups to expand commercial gaming in the State
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council Speaker is requesting a supplemental appropriation in the amount of \$6,000.00 to be allocated to contribute to the retention of a public affairs firm to conduct a focus group testing to evaluate ballot initiative proposals that would limit the expansion of gaming in the State of Michigan; and
- WHEREAS, a supplemental appropriation of \$6,000.00 for this purpose will require a modification of the Operating Budget for Fiscal Year 2004, which was approved on December 17, 2003.

NOW THEREFORE IT IS RESOLVED THAT the Tribal Council of the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians hereby approves a modification of to the Operating Budget for the Tribal Government for Fiscal Year 2004 to include a supplemental appropriation of \$6,000.00 from the Unrestricted General Fund Account to be transferred to the Tribal Ogema's Budget Professional Fees Line Item) 1000-102-5205) to be used for the Tribe's share of expenses associated with the ballot initiative focus group being organized by a consortium of Tribes and Detroit gaming interests.
