I could not believe the number of individuals who came from all over the state, from Potawatomic tribes, Ottawa and Odawa Tribes, Chippewa tribes, all coming together to enjoy the singing, dancing and listening to the beautiful sound of the drumming. Their names and where they were from are: Miss Little River Band – Riley Diehlman, Miss Odawa, from Little Traverse Band – Maaniinh Fonseca; Miss United Indian of Milwaukee – Sophia Ford from Milwaukee, Miss Wiigwaasmin

from Sag Chip. Thank you for coming to our Round Dance and representing your tribe.

I could not believe how far the people came from all over to enjoy the dancing, fun and the ability to buy from the numerous vendors we had. We are excited and glad this turned out so well and are planning on doing another next year.

I want to give special thanks to De-ahna Underwood and Don Underwood for working so hard on this project to make it a success and fun for all. Finally, I appreciate Gary Di Pizza for doing a lot of the running

around, making sure things were in place. He even went out and danced with his fancy shoes he wears. OH, Gary, it was super to see you take your elderly mother out there to shake a leg. She had the biggest smile on her face. At the same time someone talked four elders who were sitting at a table to come out and dance. Hope to see all of you at the next Round Dance, I know I will be there. This is already scheduled for Saturday, February 16, 2019 at the Three Fires Banquet area at our Casino. The Warriors Society has received approval to add a second Memorial stone to the first one that is in front of the Casino. If you have not been to Little River Band of Ottawa Indians Casino, we have in the front of the Casino a huge Memorial stone that was dedicated to our Tribal Warriors. This stone has the name of the Warrior and his/her branch of service. If a Warrior passes away a feather is put at the end

of his/her name to honor him/her. It is very impressive to look at and admire. At this time there is no more space to add names, both sides are filled. The Warriors Society has decided to add another stone, but not as big, next to the large one, with another to follow on the other side as the second stone gets filled. *Thank You, Warriors Society For This Tribute To Our People.*

Another Project the Warrior's Society is doing:

The Tribal Warriors are working on selling license plates with the Tribal Logo on the front. These will be on sale at the Spring Membership meeting. The cost will be \$10.00. So if you plan to attend the Spring Meeting look for either Chuck Fisher or Virgil Johnson to purchase one or as many as you want.

Food Distribution

The Food Distribution Program (FDPIR) was created by congress in 1977. The Food Stamp Act as an alternative to the Food Stamp Program for Indian Reservations. The program offers commodities to low income Native American households. No household may participate in both the Commodity Food Program and Snap Program, but eligible households can switch from one program to the other at the end of each month. Eligibility and participation for FDPIR are based on application and certification requiring tribal status, income and resources qualification, in determining who is eligible for the program. We are federally funded by the USDA and they set the regulations and guidelines for the Commodity Program.

UNITED TRIBES MEETING IN LANSING, MI

View from my side of the Meeting

I had the pleasure of attending my First United Tribes meeting in Lansing. Many times in the past the Ogema and the liaisons have mentioned that they went to United Tribes and things that they discussed. So when I was given a chance to go, I was excited. Gary DiPiazza drove and I was a passenger. Many told me to take something to calm my nerves as Gary is an awful driver. Well, they were wrong. He was a little fast, but I could handle it.

The first meeting we attended was with Dave Nyberg, from the Governor's Office, in the Cabinet Room at the Governor's Office in the Romney Building. This meeting was to discuss the agreement

the Governor had made with Enbridge. All 12 tribal leaders were present as well as council members, Fish and Wildlife representatives and others. The tribal leaders asked many questions to Mr. Nyberg and expressed their displeasure with this deal and asked if this agreement was final. In all I came away with a good feeling, knowing that all 12 tribes were united for a good cause. As well as getting the Governors representatives to have another meeting with the tribes to give suggestions to this agreement before it is final.

That evening we had a gathering of different government representatives and tribal leaders to meet and greet each other and to share information. I met so many representatives, that it's hard to remember all.

On Thursday, the United Tribes had their regular meeting. Again all tribes were represented by their leaders and others. They discussed Pipeline Safety Bill 616, National Indian Child Welfare, Grand River Restoration Projects, Tuition Waiver, just to name a few. In all it was such a productive meeting and such a learning experience for me. I left feeling good, knowing that all 12 tribes worked together on so many issues. I hope to go again and continue to learn.

If you have a presentation that requires a longer amount of time, please let us know in order to accommodate your workshop.
- Please also let us know if your presentation is meant to target a particular age group or other demographic.
- We also need to know if your workshop is total Anishinaabemowin immersion, if you will have a translator or if you will be presenting in the English language with some Anishinaabemowin.

Please note that if you have handouts for your presentation, you are responsible for making sure you have enough copies because there are no copiers on site.

Just as a note, most of our guests do not speak Anishinaabemowin and some understand it, but do not speak it yet. For some of our guests, this is the only time that they get to hear Anishinaabemowin being used. It would be appreciated for all of the presenters to remain visible throughout the camp and to be available to speak in Anishinaabemowin. We have had successful Camps because of the good presenters that have participated. We attend one another's presentations and socialize with the guests; we support one another and love our language.

Along with your presentation outline and biography, we

will also need to know if you require lodging. Please send all of your information by email as soon as possible and do not wait until the last minute otherwise you may not make it on the presenter list. **It would be appreciated if your presentation outline and biography could be sent as separately attached documents in the email.** It's just easier for us when we process our program book. (Phone calls are accepted to state your interest in presenting, but the **written information is required by the deadline for consideration.**)


