## **Resolution # 05-0223-82**

Approval of a full application to the Environmental Protection Agency under the Tribal Air Grant Initiative in the amount of \$146,244 for Fiscal Year 2005

- WHEREAS, the status of the *Gaá Čhíng Ziibi Daáwaa Anišhinaábek* (Little River Band of Ottawa Indians) as a sovereign and Treaty-making power is confirmed in numerous treaties, from agreements with the initial colonial powers on this land, to various treaties with the United States; and
- WHEREAS, the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians (Tribe) is descended from, and is the political successor to, the Grand River Ottawa Bands, signatories of the 1836 Treaty of Washington (7 Stat. 491) with the United States, as reaffirmed by federal law in P.L. 103-324, enacted in 1994; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted a new Constitution, pursuant to a vote of the membership on May 27, 1998, which Constitution became effective upon its approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on July 10, 1998; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted amendments to the Constitution on April 26, 2004, which became effective upon approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on May 13, 2004; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is authorized under Article IV, Section 7(a) to provide for the public health, peace, morals, education and general welfare of the Little River Band and its members; and
- WHEREAS, The Ogema and Tribal Council of the Little River Band are concerned about the quality of air within or near the Tribe's Reservation territories; are committed to assessing air quality, to determining the extent and sources of any air emissions that adversely impact public health and the environment, and to the development of standards and enforcement mechanisms that will protect public health and the environment; and

WHEREAS, under Section 103 of the Clean Air Act, funds may be awarded by EPA to address the above cited Tribal objectives, and specifically to "conduct, and promote the coordination and acceleration of, research, investigations, experiments, demonstrations, surveys, and studies relating to the causes, effects, extent, prevention, and control of air pollution."

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians by this resolution approve the submission of a full application to the Environmental Protection Agency under the Tribal Air Grant Initiative in the amount of \$146,244 for Fiscal Year FY 2005.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians commits to a cash match in the amount of \$42,000 to provide for the costs of purchasing, installing and operating a monitor for measuring particulate matter, and for the associated laboratory and reporting fees.
