Approving Purchasing 2001 Dodge Dakota SLT and 2001 Dodge Dakota Sport for the Natural Resource Department with funds coming from U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service Black Bear Study Grant in amount of \$ 23,000

- WHEREAS, the status of the *Gaá Čhíng Ziibi Daáwaa Anišhinaábek* (Little River Band of Ottawa Indians) as a sovereign and Treaty-making power is confirmed in numerous treaties, from agreements with the initial colonial powers on this land, to various treaties with the United States; and
- WHEREAS, the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians (Tribe) is descended from, and is the political successor to, the Grand River Ottawa Bands, signatories of the 1836 Treaty of Washington (7 Stat. 491) with the United States, as reaffirmed by federal law in P.L. 103-324, enacted in 1994; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted a new Constitution, pursuant to a vote of the membership on May 27, 1998, which Constitution became effective upon its approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on July 10, 1998; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted amendments to the Constitution on April 26, 2004, which became effective upon approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on May 13, 2004; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is authorized under Article IV, Section 7(a) to provide for the public health, peace, morals, education and general welfare of the Little River Band and its members; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is authorized, subject to the veto of the Tribal Ogema, under Article IV, Section 7(i)(1) of the Constitution to approve expenditures of Tribal funds; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council adopted the Budget and Appropriations Ordinance, #01-100-04, which identifies and authorizes expenditures of funds within an approved budget through regulations created by the Tribal Ogema and adopted by the Tribal Council; and
- WHEREAS, the Natural Resource Department has budgeted funds within the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service Black Bear Study Grant Program 4121-000, Account #5205, which was approved by Resolution # 05-0119-15 for costs associated with the purchase of two trucks; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has received a request for approval of the above expenditure.

NOW THEREFORE IT IS RESOLVED THAT the Tribal Council of the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians hereby approves purchasing of 2001 Dodge Dakota SLT and 2001 Dodge Dakota Sport from the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service Black Bear Study Grant Program #4121 Account 5205 in the amount of \$23,000.
