### Resolution # 05-0727-341

*Approval of Travel to send three (3) employees to RPMS Patient Registration and Scheduling Training, Kewadin Hotel and Convention Center, Sault Ste. Marie, Michigan. Training is conducted by Great Lakes Inter-Tribal Council, sponsored by Indian Health Service. All patient care software applications within the RPMS refer to this system for patient demographics, automatically sending updated information to the IHS Data Center in Albuquerque, NM.*

WHEREAS, the status of the *Gaá Čhíng Ziibi Daáwaa Aníshinaábek* (Little River Band of Ottawa Indians) as a sovereign and Treaty-making power is confirmed in numerous treaties, from agreements with the initial colonial powers on this land, to various treaties with the United States; and

WHEREAS, the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians (Tribe) is descended from, and is the political successor to, the Grand River Ottawa Bands, signatories of the 1836 Treaty of Washington (7 Stat. 491) with the United States, as reaffirmed by federal law in P.L. 103-324, enacted in 1994; and

WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted a new Constitution, pursuant to a vote of the membership on May 27, 1998, which Constitution became effective upon its approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on July 10, 1998; and

WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted amendments to the Constitution on April 26, 2004, which became effective upon approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on May 13, 2004; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is authorized under Article IV, Section 7(a) to provide for the public health, peace, morals, education and general welfare of the Little River Band and its members; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council, pursuant to Article IV, Section 7 (i)(2) of the Constitution, has the power to manage any funds within the exclusive control of the Tribe and to appropriate such funds for the benefit of the Tribe and its members; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council passed resolution # 05-0720-333 suspending travel without authorization as essential; and


NOW THEREFORE IT IS RESOLVED THAT the Tribal Council of the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians hereby approves travel for three (3) employees; Janice Grant, Clinic and Community Health Supervisor, Gina Wright, CHS Supervisor and Amy Bialik, Medical Assistant, Sandra Lewis will be an alternate attendee if necessary, to attend RPMS Patient Registration and Scheduling, approved in the operating Budget for the Tribal Government for Fiscal Year 2005, Program #4103 – Contact Health.
