## **Resolution # 05-0817-389**

Approving Travel Authorization Requests for Gaming Commission Staff

- WHEREAS, the status of the *Gaá Čhíng Ziibi Daáwaa Anišhinaábek* (Little River Band of Ottawa Indians) as a sovereign and Treaty-making power is confirmed in numerous treaties, from agreements with the initial colonial powers on this land, to various treaties with the United States; and
- WHEREAS, the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians (Tribe) is descended from, and is the political successor to, the Grand River Ottawa Bands, signatories of the 1836 Treaty of Washington (7 Stat. 491) with the United States, as reaffirmed by federal law in P.L. 103-324, enacted in 1994; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted a new Constitution, pursuant to a vote of the membership on May 27, 1998, which Constitution became effective upon its approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on July 10, 1998; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted amendments to the Constitution on April 26, 2004, which became effective upon approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on May 13, 2004; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is authorized under Article IV, Section 7(a) to provide for the public health, peace, morals, education and general welfare of the Little River Band and its members; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is authorized, subject to the veto of the Tribal Ogema, under Article IV, Section 7(i)(1) of the Constitution to approve expenditures of Tribal funds; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council adopted the Budget and Appropriations Ordinance, #01-100-04, which identifies and authorizes expenditures of funds within an approved budget through regulations created by the Tribal Ogema and adopted by the Tribal Council; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has, in Gaming Commission Ordinance No. 04-400-04, created a Gaming Commission and delegated to such Commission the authority to regulate all gaming activities authorized by the Triba and to enforce all Tribal and federal laws governing the conduct of Tribally-licensed gaming activities; and

- WHEREAS, the Gaming Commission shall pursuant to Section 6.02 (g) of the Gaming Commission Ordinance (Ordinance #04-400-04), arrange for training of Gaming Commissioners, Gaming Commission employees and others in areas relating to the regulation of gaming; and
- WHEREAS, Gaming Commission staff member Kelly Maser submitted a request to travel on October 24<sup>th</sup> 29th, 2005 to attend the Phoenix Rising Unlimited Total Effective Asset Management Training in New Orleans, Louisiana; and
- WHEREAS, this training will be beneficial to the staff member as it will be covering a large range of information from recognizing scams, organized crime & gaming to working effectively with other departments; and
- WHEREAS, the <u>Gaming Commission</u> has budgeted funds available within Program #1000-121 to cover all travel and training expenses; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has received a request from the Gaming Commission for approval of the staff member to attend this training.

NOW THEREFORE IT IS RESOLVED THAT the Tribal Council of the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians hereby approves the Travel Authorization Requests for Kelly Maser to travel on October 24<sup>th</sup> – 29th, 2005 to New Orleans, Louisiana to attend the Phoenix Rising Unlimited Total Effective Asset Management Training.
