Authorization for the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians to apply for an additional extension of time to file the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians 2004 Audited Financial Statements to the Federal Government

- WHEREAS, the status of the *Gaá Čhíng Ziibi Daáwaa Anišhinaábek* (Little River Band of Ottawa Indians) as a sovereign and Treaty-making power is confirmed in numerous treaties, from agreements with the initial colonial powers on this land, to various treaties with the United States; and
- WHEREAS, the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians (Tribe) is descended from, and is the political successor to, the Grand River Ottawa Bands, signatories of the 1836 Treaty of Washington (7 Stat. 491) with the United States, as reaffirmed by federal law in P.L. 103-324, enacted in 1994; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted a new Constitution, pursuant to a vote of the membership on May 27, 1998, which Constitution became effective upon its approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on July 10, 1998; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted amendments to the Constitution on April 26, 2004, which became effective upon approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on May 13, 2004; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is authorized under Article IV, Section 7(a) to provide for the public health, peace, morals, education and general welfare of the Little River Band and its members; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council adopted, in accordance with Article IV, Section 7(a) of the Constitution, the <u>Audit Reform Act of 2005</u> which identifies how audits are conducted and reported by the Tribe and assigning specific duties for external audits to the Tribal Council; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe conducts audits of its activities for the purpose of compliance with federal laws and agreements with external entities; and

- WHEREAS, the Tribe has encountered extenuating circumstances that would prevent the completion and submission of year ending December 31, 2004 audit by the due date of September 30, 2005; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe applied for an initial extension of time on August 22, 2005 which was approved on August 29, 2005 by the United States Department of the Interior to extend the filing date for the audit and it has been identified that additional time will be necessary to complete the audit; and
- WHEREAS, the accounting firm of Ribail, Stauffer and Associates anticipates the audit process to begin the audit during the month of January, 2006; and
- WHEREAS, the Comptroller General has identified that the audit is anticipated to be completed prior to March 31, 2006;

NOW THEREFORE IT IS RESOLVED THAT the Tribal Council of the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians authorizes the Tribal Council Speaker to submit a request to the United States Department of the Interior, Office of Inspector General for the purpose of requesting an additional extension of time for the submission of the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians audit to the Federal Government until March 31, 2006.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED THAT all correspondence received by the Tribe's Comptroller General shall be immediately copied to the Tribal Council and Ogema for review.
