Approval of Expenditure for <u>Gaming Commission – Filemaker Pro 8 Database</u> <u>Development & Training with Mr. Troy Opdycke</u>

- WHEREAS, the status of the Gaá Čhíng Ziíbi Daáwaa Anišhinaábek (Little River Band of Ottawa Indians) as a sovereign and Treaty-making power is confirmed in numerous treaties, from agreements with the initial colonial powers on this land, to various treaties with the United States; and\
- WHEREAS, the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians (Tribe) is descended from, and is the political successor to, the Grand River Ottawa Bands, signatories of the 1836 Treaty of Washington (7 Stat. 491) with the United States, as reaffirmed by federal law in P.L. 103-324, enacted in 1994; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted a new Constitution, pursuant to a vote of the membership on May 27, 1998, which Constitution became effective upon its approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on July 10, 1998; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted amendments to the Constitution on April 26, 2004, which became effective upon approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on May 13, 2004; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is authorized under Article IV, Section 7(a) to provide for the public health, peace, morals, education and general welfare of the Little River Band and its members; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is authorized, subject to the veto of the Tribal Ogema, under Article IV, Section 7(i)(1) of the Constitution to approve expenditures of Tribal funds; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council adopted the Budget and Appropriations Ordinance, #01-100-04, which identifies and authorizes expenditures of funds within an approved budget through regulations created by the Tribal Ogema and adopted by the Tribal Council; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council, pursuant to Article IV, Section 7(b) of the Constitution of the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians (the Band's "Constitution"), has the power to authorize contracts negotiated on behalf of the Band; and

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Ogema, pursuant to Article VI, Section 5(a) of the Tribal Constitution, is authorized to negotiate and execute contracts on behalf of the Band, provided such contracts are approved and ratified by the Tribal Council; and
- WHEREAS, in accordance with Gaming Commission Ordinance #04-400-04, Section 6.02(g) the Gaming Commission shall arrange for training of Gaming Commissioners, Gaming Commission employees and others in areas relating to the regulation of gaming; and
- WHEREAS, Mr. Troy Opdycke has agreed to provide Filemaker Pro 8 software training and database development for staff of the Gaming Commission; and
- WHEREAS, the <u>Gaming Commission</u> has budgeted funds within Program #1000-121 source code 200, line item # 5205 for costs of the training plus travel expenses; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has received a request from the Gaming Commission for approval of an expenditure for on site training from Mr. Troy Opdycke for such services.

NOW THEREFORE IT IS RESOLVED THAT the Tribal Council of the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians hereby approves the expenditure of budgeted funds within Program #1000-121, Account #5205 in the amount of \$982.17 plus lodging expenses for the Filemaker Pro 8 Database Development & Training December 15th thru December 17th, 2005.
