## **Resolution #05-1214-672**

Approval of Travel Request of Paralegal to the Tribal Prosecutor

- WHEREAS, the status of the *Gaá Čhing Ziíbi Daáwaa Anišhinaábek* (Little River Band of Ottawa Indians) as a sovereign and Treaty-making power is confirmed in numerous treaties, from agreements with the initial colonial powers on this land, to various treaties with the United States; and
- WHEREAS, the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians (Tribe) is descended from, and is the political successor to, the Grand River Ottawa Bands, signatories of the 1836 Treaty of Washington (7 Stat. 491) with the United States, as reaffirmed by federal law in P.L. 103-324, enacted in 1994; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted a new Constitution, pursuant to a vote of the membership on May 27, 1998, which Constitution became effective upon its approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on July 10, 1998; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted amendments to the Constitution on April 26, 2004, which became effective upon approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on May 13, 2004; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is authorized under Article VI, Section 7(a) to provide for the public health, peace, morals, education and general welfare of the Little River Band and its members; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council adopted Resolution #05-0720-333, *Restrictions on Travel*, on July 20, 2005, which states that "any travel related activities that are deemed necessary during this suspension period must be authorized by a resolution of the Tribal Council approving the expenditure and authorizing the justification for the travel."; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Prosecutor asks that the Tribal Council approve his Paralegal's request to attend a training seminar being offered by the Prosecuting Attorney's Association of Michigan entitled "Elements of Advocacy Basic Training" and being held January 10-13, 2006 in Big Rapids, Michigan; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Prosecutor believes that this conference will better enable his Paralegal to more efficiently perform her duties as appointed victim advocate for the Tribal Prosecutor's office.
