Resolution # 05-1214-673

Approving Travel for Grant Program #4207 for the Police Officers Gaming Seminar on January 22nd-28th, 2006 – Travel will be to Atlantic City, NJ

WHEREAS, the status of the *Gaá Čhíng Ziibi Daáwaa Aníshinaábek* (Little River Band of Ottawa Indians) as a sovereign and Treaty-making power is confirmed in numerous treaties, from agreements with the initial colonial powers on this land, to various treaties with the United States; and

WHEREAS, the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians (Tribe) is descended from, and is the political successor to, the Grand River Ottawa Bands, signatories of the 1836 Treaty of Washington (7 Stat. 491) with the United States, as reaffirmed by federal law in P.L. 103-324, enacted in 1994; and

WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted a new Constitution, pursuant to a vote of the membership on May 27, 1998, which Constitution became effective upon its approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on July 10, 1998; and

WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted amendments to the Constitution on April 26, 2004, which became effective upon approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on May 13, 2004; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is authorized under Article IV, Section 7(a) to provide for the public health, peace, morals, education and general welfare of the Little River Band and its members; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is authorized under Article IV, Section 7(i)(2) to exercise fiscal powers, and manage any funds within the exclusive control of the Little River Band; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council enacted Resolutions #05-0720-333 and #05-0803-363, temporarily revising the manner in which tribal funds are approved for expenditure on travel related activities, due to government funds in excess of \$235,000.00 being spent on such activities at the time the resolution was adopted; and

WHEREAS, the Travel expenditure for the Public Safety Department proposed is requested to be processed and authorized during the time period that requires approval by the Tribal Council prior to expending the government funds for this purpose; and

WHEREAS, the Public Safety Department warrants to the Tribal Council that the travel related expenses requested for approval by this resolution are:

1. Pre-planned and budgeted activity within the department, and
2. The travel is necessary to fulfill the goals and objectives of the Department.

WHEREAS, the Travel is necessary for the continued good standing of the 2004 Tribal Resource grant, program #4207; and


WHEREAS, the Tribe realizes that game protection is one of the most critical aspects of gaming for enforcement personnel. The Police Gaming Seminar outlines the basic rules to be followed to ensure that the game is kept under control and free of cheating scams.


