

OPEN SESSION MINUTES

The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians Tribal Council held a meeting at the Little River Band Community Center on May 29, 2002. Following are the minutes of that meeting.

D. Tribal Council Minutes

The meeting minutes were removed during agenda review.

E. Public Comment Period

Kimberly Alexander arrived at 10:07 a.m.

Matthew Stratton asked about the property at Indian Village, which is adjacent to Tribal Trust lands. Parsons responded that the Council is making efforts to investigate the property, as well as pursuing reservation restoration. Stratton informed the Council that based on his personal experiences regarding his individual rights, it is very important to address the reservation boundary and jurisdiction issues for the Tribe and for the benefit of Tribal members.

III. Continuing Business

A. Grants & Contracts
None submitted.

Dan Shepard arrived at 10:15 a.m.

B. CMT Business

1. Bulletin #57 – Tile work for bathroom

Fisher informed the Council that this item is for installing additional tile in the four public bathrooms near the gaming area. Cunningham Limp is requesting that this item be paid as additional work. Fisher indicated that the CMT is negotiating to include the installation within the tile allowance to cut costs. McCatty questioned whether tile in the 4 public restrooms being discussed was including the proposed tile work presented in the project scope of work. Fisher responded no. Fisher informed the Council that there was an overage of approximately \$200,000.00, and the CMT had requested Cunningham Limp to forward confirmation of the overage in writing, but has not yet received confirmation from Cunningham Limp. Fisher suggested that CMT could go back to Cunningham Limp regarding men's restroom facilities continuing to argue that the current project is not an 'upgrade' as required in the contract. Discussion of the whether or not this work constituted an 'upgrade' in accordance with the construction contract ensued. Fisher stated approval for the additional work was a CMT recommendation. Parsons asked if there was a timeframe within this work would be done. Fisher estimated the work would be completed very near June 20th.

Discussion regarding Gaming Commission ensued during the wait for Joe LaPorte to arrive.

Joe LaPorte arrived at 10:26 a.m.

B. Field Training Officer Program Presentation

LaPorte informed the Council that all Tribal Police officers will be required to attend the BIA Academy. LaPorte indicated that the Field Training program is a 14-week program. Parsons asked if this training will become in-house training, following the completion for the instructors. LaPorte stated following participation, the Police Department will have an in-house program and will have 3 training employees to do the training of the rest of the police. Sam asked if administration has been approached regarding the application of personnel policy, as completion of this program is required of new officers, which extends the probationary period. LaPorte stated he has not discussed this with Human Resources.

Katie Glocheski arrived at 10:30 a.m.

Sam asked that LaPorte follow-up with Human Resources regarding the probationary period provisions.

Joe LaPorte left at 10:34 a.m.

C. Adoption of Amended Enrollment Ordinance #02-200-01

Parsons stated there have been many work sessions regarding the amendments. Spalding asked for an overview of the changes to the Ordinance. House stated the amendments include: clarification of documentary evidence and the process by which enrollment applications are reviewed and processed. House reviewed the application and review process. It was noted that there is a 30-day appeal period following a determination by the Commission, and if the applicant does not appeal within the timeframe, the applicant forfeits their right to appeal to Tribal Court. It was noted that the initial determination in writing is done by the Enrollment Commission for eligible and ineligible applicants. The Tribal Court's ability to rule is limited to reviewing whether or not the Enrollment Commission interpreted the ordinance and their regulations accurately. The Tribal Court's function is to oversee that processes were followed and abided by. House stated there is no clear indication that new information cannot be filed to increase blood quantum. House stated the Enrollment Ordinance places no liability with the Tribe to prove or disprove blood quantum, the applicant must be able to provide proof.

McCatty asked Alexander if the current blood quantum is relayed to the new member at the time of membership. Alexander stated it is. Shepard asked if there is a process set up for increasing blood quantum. House stated there is nothing that prohibits members for applying for an increase in their blood quantum determination. Parsons clarified the appeal process applies to a specific decision relative to an application. Glocheski asked when this amendment goes into effect. Parsons replied the amendments are effective July 29, 2002, if adopted today. House stated there is some training that will occur with these amendments. Alexander and Glocheski stated they have already been implementing portions of the new processes and standards that could be implemented, in anticipation that the Ordinance will be modified, to be in compliance. Council stated this was a good thing.

D. Adoption of Residential Building Ordinance #02-550-01

Sam stated for the record that as a Council member, she believes that building codes are legislative in nature, and issues that require regulations or policies on the reservation are within the province of the Tribal Council and she does not believe that the Executive Order issued by the Ogema to determine building codes is valid, as the Ogema cannot legislate. Sam further commented that she believes approving building codes was beyond the scope of the Ogema's authority. Sam doesn't think the Council should endorse an executive order that was not within the constitutional definitions of the Ogema's power. Sam wanted to say for the record that she does not endorse that. Porter asked about the "it is further resolved that" and why this is included. Sam asked what entity the building permits are issued to. Shepard stated issued to Little River Housing Commission. Sam asked who signs or issues the permits. Shepard stated they have not been signed yet.

3. Gaming Commission

Sam recommended that House prepare a communication to Operations regarding the Gaming Commission employing staff. House stated she would draft that memo. Bennett asked the question regarding the Gaming Commission employing staff and that these rules were changed once before. McCatty asked that this be a clarified more and what responsibilities lie with whom. House indicated that as a result of the amendments adopted by the Tribal Council, the Gaming Commission is the top of the organizational chart, with staff, compliance and surveillance subordinated to the Commission. House stated the chairperson is the supervisor of said employees. House stated the change occurred with the adoption of the Gaming Commission Ordinance. McCatty has question regarding background check and if the bylaws state a background check is done but doesn't have to be conducted by the Gaming Commission and if the background check has to pass. House stated potential employees have to meet the standard and cannot be employed if they do not meet that standard. Spalding stated to McCatty that the provision would remain. McCatty clarified that Spalding and House are saying

different things regarding the background check. House stated as long as standard remains the qualifications to be an employee of the Gaming Commission must follow the ordinance.
