Definition of FTE's from Resort Financial Analyst:

*FTE - Full-time equivalent is considered to be 2,080 hours per year and is calculated as:

- 8 hours per day
- x 5 work days per week
- x 52 weeks per year
- = 2,080 hours per year

The Resort does not budget based on "headcount" but uses total projected hours worked and converts those hours to FTEs.

The budgeted numbers above represent peak totals. While there are some fixed positions budgeted, most are variable and total number of hours worked may/should fluctuate based on business volumes and averaged PTO hours.

Little River Holdings handed out samples and gifts at the Fall Membership Meeting on October 12, 2019 to Tribal Members. We also had management staff and board members in attendance at the Meet & Greets for any questions.

In collaboration with the LRBOI Commerce Department, Little River Holdings supported the Elders Conference in November by bringing in a

InTerra: Our brand-awareness campaign is now completed, and we have moved on to a marketing campaign in order to market our InTerra products across the country. This has already dramatically increased website traffic and sales. You can find our products for sale on our InTerra website, Amazon, or at the Little River Casino Resort Gift Shop.

Advanced Protein Solutions (APS): We met with a major retailer recently to propose a plant -based alternative solution that will advance the retailer's already strong private label natural brands. We attended a follow-up meeting with them the last week of October and continue to negotiate how we can all work together to further our missions.

Little River Real Estate Management

All of our rental units are currently leased. We have executed three land contracts with Tribal Members on our in-town properties that have been listed for sale to the membership since May.

We have been continuously working on the next stage of the US-31/M-22 development and everything is moving along nicely. Meetings have taken place and continue regarding zoning and funding ideas.

Little River Development

Sales are continuing at our Odeno subdivision in Fruitport. Plans are already in the works for our next phase since Phase 1 is almost half sold out.

Little River Government Contracting

This is an exciting time for Little River Government Contracting. Once we have our 8(a) designation in hand, we will be able to begin growing a seven generations business for the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians. This new business will develop steady and stable income for the Tribe and Tribal Citizens. LRGC has already received its HubZone certification and is negotiating several potential contracts.

EDC board meetings are held the 4th Wednesday of the month at 3pm, except for months where that Wednesday falls on or close to a holiday. Open session/public comment starts promptly at 3pm, and Tribal Members are welcome to attend that portion of the meeting. The next scheduled meeting is November 20, 2019.



The Breakdown of a Criminal Investigation

The general consensus is a police officer's main job is to arrest people. While this is indeed true, police have the authority to make an arrest, it is not as simplistic as it may appear. There is more to a case than just arresting an individual.

To provide a better understanding, here is a breakdown of an investigation:

Criminal Act-

A violation of a law established by the Tribe, State, or Federal Governments. Each law has specific elements that the offender must violate in order to "break" the law.

Complainant-

For every investigation there is a person who makes the initial report. The subject who requests police to report a crime has occurred is known as the complainant. This can be the initial caller, the victim, or even the officer.

Victim-

The subject of an investigation who is deprived, defrauded, harmed, injured or killed during a criminal act.

Witness-

A subject who was present during the time of the criminal act or can provide a factual account verifying whether or not the criminal act occurred.

Suspect-

The subject of an investigation thought to have committed the criminal act.

Once on scene, the officer obtains facts through interviews and collects evidence of the criminal act. Depending on the case, typically the officer leaves the scene without making an arrest. In any arrest, probable cause has to be established to make an arrest. If an officer can determine probable cause, specifically if the criminal act was committed in their presence, a physical arrest can occur.

Probable Cause-

Reasonable belief that a crime has been committed.

If no arrest is made, statements and evidence are detailed in a police report. The police report after it is completed, is submitted to the jurisdiction specific prosecutor. The prosecutor will review the facts of the case and determine if probable cause exists. If the prosecutor finds probable cause does exist a warrant will be issued, which has to be reviewed and signed by a judge.

Warrant-

Court order for the named subject to be taken into custody. Warrants typically come with varying bond amounts, which can be posted in lieu of physical custody inside a jail.

If the prosecutor does not find probable cause has been established, the charges will be declined. Should more facts and/or evidence be obtained to support probable cause, the report can be resubmitted to the prosecutor's office for review.

Once a physical arrest is made, the subject is then scheduled for arraignment. During arraignment, the subject is advised of the charges brought against them. From this point on, the court process for the subject would begin.

Most criminal complaints are initiated by a member of the community. It is the responsibility of the police department to respond and investigate each complaint. There are a variety of cases with different circumstances, which could lead to investigations taking days, weeks, months or even years to complete. The goal of the police department is to seek justice for the victims in each case. This is a short breakdown of a criminal investigation.

The safety of a community is a team effort...join the team!

Information for Human-Bear Encounters Sightings versus Encounters versus Attacks

Encounters are defined as situations occurring within 50 yds. There are two types.





Defensive encounters- where the bear may feel threatened by your presence. This could mean you're too close and you surprised the bear or it's a sow with cubs. A defensive bear will appear agitated and show signs of stress (huffing or tooth chomping).

Non-defensive encounters- may occur for several reasons. The bears may be curious; its approach is slow and hesitant with ears and head raised as it sniffs the air. These bears may be bold and will approach a human to test its dominance.

Attacks- are when physical contact is made between a bear and a human.

How to Act During an Encounter

Remain Calm- assess the situation. If the bear seems unaware of you, move away quietly when the bear is not looking. Continue to observe the bear as you, retreat watching for changes in its behavior. Often a bear will move away when it realizes you are human.

DO NOT RUN

Never intentionally approach a black bear; this could invoke an aggressive response. If you want the bear to leave, talk firmly to the bear and make noise, like clapping your hands, stomping your feet or blowing a whistle.

Watch for behavioral signs -look for signs of stress like teeth chomping or huffing. A BEAR STANDING ON THEIR HIND LEGS IS NOT A SIGN OF AGGRESSION. Bears' sense of smell is what they mostly depend on to warn them of danger. They see movement or hear a sound and then stand on their hind legs in an attempt to sniff the air for your scent or to assess escape routes.

If you hear bear vocalizations or suspect cubs are present -LEAVE THE AREA IMMEDIATELY, DO NOT RUN!

Dealing with a defensive bear that is stressed- your goal is to reduce that stress by appearing non-threatening. Talk in a low but firm voice, back away if the bear is not moving in your direction. Do not throw things at the bear. Increasing distance from the bear is the best way to resolve the situation.

Defensive bears that are agitated will sometimes "bluff charge." If you experience that, STAND YOUR GROUND, DO NOT RUN. USE BEAR SPRAY IF YOU HAVE IT. IF YOU ARE HUNTING AND HAVE A FIREARM, AS A LAST RESORT TO AVOID AN ATTACK, FIRE A WARNING SHOT INTO THE GOUND A FEW FEET IN FRONT OF YOU.

Non- defensive bears might approach deliberately- showing no signs of stress, may be curious, may be food-conditioned or asserting dominance. With a non-defensive bear; STOP, remain calm, talk in a firm voice while moving away from the animal. Give the bear an escape route by moving off the trail, uphill if possible. If the bear follows you, stop and stand your ground.

If a bear enters your tent or hunting blind-shout, wave your arms, clap loudly.

A bear that continues to approach IS A SERIOUS THREAT. You should act AGGRESSIVELY letting the bear know that you will fight if attacked. Clapping your hands loudly is effective with black bears; however, your response should become more aggressive. Shout, stomp your feet, look the animal in the eyes AND TAKE A FEW STEPS TOWARD THE BEAR.

If the bear attacks FIGHT BACK by kicking and punching the bear and gouging at its eyes. YOU ARE IN A FIGHT FOR YOUR LIFE AT THAT POINT. IF YOU ARE HUNTING AND HAVE A WEAPON, USE IT.

DEER HUNTERS REMEMBER

Carry bear spray

Notify someone of your hunting plans (If you hunt alone)

Carry a whistle

Use of deer scents will attract bears (USE WITH CAUTION)

Don't hunt alone if possible

LRBOI was Among Ten Other Tribes Represented at the 6th Annual Tribal Leadership Summit

The beautiful and historic Mackinac Island was once again home to the annual Tribal Leadership Summit, sponsored by United Three Fires Against Violence.

The event took place at the Mission Point Resort on October 1-2 where 11 of the 12 Michigan Tribes were represented. In attendance for LRBOI were Tribal Council Member, Diane Lonn; Unified Legal, Elise McGowan-Cuellar; Family Services Director, Jason Cross; Victim Services Program Outreach Specialist, Michol Tanner; and Victim Services Program Manager, Shanaviah Canales. Elise and Shanaviah both serve as members of the Uniting Three Fires Against Violence Coalition Board.

The Tribal Leadership Summit is an opportunity for Michigan Tribes to join voices in addressing issues of violence against women in Indian country. This year, the event presenters included:

David Adams, Partner, Parnall & Adams Law: David is an enrolled member of the Sault St. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians. He addressed how understanding sovereignty and social detriments of health can be used to empower victims of trauma.

Sandra Pilgrim-Lewis, Division of Victim Services, Michigan Department of Health and Human Services: Sandra is a Lakota Sioux and longtime social change activist and advocate who has given tirelessly to the issues impacting Native women. Her presentation, Continuing the Journey to Change: Walking with Michigan Tribes and the Division of Victim Services" was an impactful reminder that it takes all of us working together to impact change. Encouraging the fact that 100% of Michigan's Tribal programs have access to the Division of Victim Services technical assistance and support.

Leslie Hagen, National Indian Country Training Coordinator, Department of Justice: Leslie has many years of experience representing the Native issues at the government level. At the Summit, her presentation centered on the investigation and prosecution of non-fatal strangulation. Sadly, strangulation is a growing problem in intimate partner violence; one that can quickly lead to the unintended death of the victim.

Anna Heiselman, SDVCJ Project Coordinator, and Michael Long, Tribal Court Judge, both of the Grand Traverse Band of Ottawa and Chippewa Indians: Anna and Michael led a special domestic violence criminal jurisdiction panel discussion. The purpose of the discussion was to aid those in attendance in better understanding the struggles and rewards of working toward gaining sovereignty over complete criminal jurisdiction on reservations of crimes committed against Native women by non-native perpetrators.

Elizabeth Carr, Senior Native Affairs Advisor, National Indigenous Women's

Resource Center: Elizabeth is an enrolled member of the Sault St. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians. Her role at the Summit was to provide legislative updates surrounding the many programs such as the Violence Against Women's Act that allows programs such as LRBOI's Victim Services Program to do the work they do to empower survivors in making a better life for themselves.







Events such as the Tribal Leadership Summit and activities that took place across our Michigan Tribes and globally in October in honor of National Domestic Violence Month are needed to bring awareness to the growing problem of intimate partner violence. While it is recognized that men can be victimized, statistics prove that Native women are at an increased risk of victimization as compared to others. As violence is not a Native tradition, we must all come together to return to our roots and demand the changes that will assure that our people, especially our women and girls, can live the lives intended by our Creator.






The staff of the Victim Services Program would like to thank the Muskegon satellite office receptionist, Shawnee Damm-Hajdu, for all the work she does to assist our program.
