## Resolution #16-0210-037

Approving Tribal Ogema's Execution of Agreement with Indian Health Services Bemidji Area
Office

- WHEREAS, the status of the *Gaá Čhíng Ziibi Daáwaa Anišhinaábek* (Little River Band of Ottawa Indians) as a sovereign and Treaty-making power is confirmed in numerous treaties, from agreements with the initial colonial powers on this land, to various treaties with the United States; and
- WHEREAS, the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians (Tribe) is descended from, and is the political successor to, the Grand River Ottawa Bands, signatories of the 1836 Treaty of Washington (7 Stat. 491) with the United States, as reaffirmed by federal law in P.L. 103-324, enacted in 1994; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted a new Constitution, pursuant to a vote of the membership on May 27, 1998, which Constitution became effective upon its approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on July 10, 1998; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted amendments to the Constitution on April 26, 2004, which became effective upon approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on May 13, 2004; and
- WHEREAS, the legislative powers of the Tribe are vested in the Tribal Council according to Article IV, Section 1 of the Constitution; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is authorized by Article IV, Section 7(a)(1) and (2) to exercise the inherent powers of the Tribe by establishing laws through the enactment of ordinances and adoption of resolutions to govern the conduct of Tribal Members and others within the Tribe's jurisdiction and to promote, protect and provide for the public health, peace, morals, education and general welfare of the Tribe and its members; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is authorized by Article IV, Section 7(b) to authorize and ratify agreements and contracts negotiated by the Tribal Ogema on behalf of the Little River Band with political subdivisions or private parties on all matters within the authority of the Tribal Council; and

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is authorized by Article IV, Section 7(i)(2) to manage any funds within the exclusive control of the Little River Band and to appropriate these funds for the benefit of the Tribe and its members; and
- WHEREAS, the executive powers of the Tribe are vested in the Tribal Ogema according to Article V, Section 1 of the Constitution; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Ogema is authorized to consult, negotiate and execute agreements and contracts on behalf of the Little River Band with governments, political subdivisions ad private parties subject to authorization and ratification by Tribal Council.
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Ogema has consulted and negotiated with Indian Health Services Bemidji Area Office for an Agreement to provide Pharmacy Buyback Services to the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians Health Services. Indian Health Services Bemidji Area Office is a Regional Federal Agency that provides services and support to Federally Recognized Tribes in Michigan, Illinois, Wisconsin and Minnesota.

NOW THEREFORE IT IS RESOLVED, that the Tribal Council approves the Tribal Ogema's execution of the agreement with Indian Health Services Bemidji Area Office.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Tribal Council authorizes a limited waiver of immunity for actions on specific performance of this Agreement in the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians Tribal Court, provided that such waiver does not authorize actions for damages beyond specific performance.

IT IS FURTHER / FINALLY RESOLVED, that the Tribal Administrator for this Agreement shall be the Director of Health Services.
