### Resolution #16-0210-041

## Amending Compensation for Tribal Court Judges

- WHEREAS, the status of the *Gaá Čhíng Ziibi Daáwaa Anishinaábek* (Little River Band of Ottawa Indians) as a sovereign and a treaty-making power is confirmed in numerous treaties, from agreements with the initial colonial powers on this land, to various treaties with the United States; and
- WHEREAS, the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians (Tribe) is descended from, and is the political successor to, the Grand River Ottawa Bands, signatories of the 1836 Treaty of Washington (7 Stat. 491) with the United States, as reaffirmed by federal law in P.L. 103-324, enacted in 1994; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted a new Constitution, pursuant to a vote of the membership on May 27, 1998, which Constitution became effective upon its approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on July 10, 1998; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted amendments to the Constitution on April 26, 2004, which became effective upon approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on May 13, 2004; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is authorized under Article IV, Section 7(a) of the Constitution to provide for the public health, peace, morals, education and general welfare of the Little River Band and its members; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council finds that the current compensation levels remain appropriate compensation, excepting the distinction made between lawyer and non-lawyer Appellate Justices.
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council approved Resolution #06-0315-187, Ratifying the Inclusion of Tribal Court Judicial Officers in the Life Insurance and Certain other Tribal Government Employee Benefits; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council approved Resolution #09-0415-98; which continued the compensation for Tribal Court Judges; and

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council approved Resolution #11-0420-1333, which continued the compensation for Tribal Court Judges; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council approved Resolution #13-0501-094, which continued the compensation for Tribal Court Judges; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council approved Resolution #14-0903-276, which made modification to the compensation for Tribal Court Judges: and
- WHEREAS, Resolution #00-1220-12, Establishing the Compensation Levels for Tribal Judges, Resolution #05-0720-326, Re-Affirming the Compensation for Judicial Officers Previously Set by Resolution #00-1220-12, Resolution #06-0315-187, Ratifying the Inclusion of Tribal Court Judicial Officers in the Life Insurance and Certain Other Tribal Government Employee Benefits, Resolution #09-0415-98, Continuing the Compensation for Tribal Court Judges, Resolution #11-0420-133, Continuing the Compensation for Tribal Court Appellate Judges, Resolution #13-0501-094, Continuing the Compensation for Tribal Court Judges were rescinded and replaced with Resolution #14-0903-276; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council approved Resolution #15-0415-116, which authorized and made modification to the compensation for Tribal Court Judges.

NOW THEREFORE IT IS RESOLVED THAT the Tribal Council of the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians hereby amends the compensation of the Tribal Court Judges as follows:

- 1. Monetary Compensation. The Court consists of two Tribal Court Judges and three Court of Appeals Justices. Monetary compensation for each position shall be as follows:
  - a. Chief Judge. The Chief Judge shall be compensated in the form of a \$3,000.00 stipend per month.
  - b. Associate Judge. The Associate Judge shall be compensated in the form of a \$2,500.00 stipend per month.
  - c. Appellate Justices. Appellate justices who are licensed attorneys shall be compensated in the form of a \$1,500.00 stipend per case heard assigned. Appellate justices who are not licensed attorneys shall be compensated in the form of a \$1,000.00 stipend per case heard.
