Resolution #16-0224-060

Authorizing Sonosky Chambers Law Firm to Represent the Tribe until the Completion of the NLRB case

- WHEREAS, the status of the *Gaá Čhíng Ziíbi Daáwaa Aníšhinaábek* (the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians) as a sovereign treaty-making power is confirmed in numerous treaties, from agreements with initial colonial powers to various treaties with the United States; and
- WHEREAS, the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians is descended from, and is political successor to, the Grand River Ottawa Bands, signatories of the 1836 Treaty of Washington (7 Stat. 491) with the United States, as reaffirmed in 1994 by Public Law 103-324; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted a new Constitution by vote of the membership on May 27, 1998, which Constitution became effective upon approval by the Assistant Secretary for Indian Affairs on July 10, 1998; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is authorized by Article IV, Section 7(a) of the Constitution to provide for and to protect the public health, peace, morals, education and general welfare of the Tribe and its members; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is authorized by Article IV, Section 7(e) to employ legal counsel on behalf of the Tribe; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is authorized by Article IV, Section 7(i)(2) to manage any funds within the exclusive control of the Little River Band and to appropriate these funds for the benefit of the Tribe and its members; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has already authorized Sonosky Chambers to represent the Tribe at the Supreme Court of the United States of American in their efforts to have the Tribe's Cert Petition granted; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council already has an agreement in place that allows Sonosky Chambers to represent the Tribe;

NOW THEREFORE IT IS RESOLVED, that the Tribal Council hereby approves the expenditure of a sum not to exceed \$500,000 (five hundred thousand dollars) toward the fees and costs required to file, pursue, and argue the Cert Petition at the Supreme Court of the United States of America until the NLRB case is finally resolved; and
