Resolution #16-0309-071

Approving of a formula grant application to the Family Violence Prevention and Services – Domestic Violence Shelter and Supportive Services – Grants to Native American Tribe and Tribal Organizations – funding level to be determined by funding agency

WHEREAS, the status of the *Gaá Čhíng Ziibi Daáwaa Aníshinaábek* (Little River Band of Ottawa Indians) as a sovereign and Treaty-making power is confirmed in numerous treaties, from agreements with the initial colonial powers on this land, to various treaties with the United States; and

WHEREAS, the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians (Tribe) is descended from, and is the political successor to, the Grand River Ottawa Bands, signatories of the 1836 Treaty of Washington (7 Stat. 491) with the United States, as reaffirmed by federal law in P.L. 103-324, enacted in 1994; and

WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted a new Constitution, pursuant to a vote of the membership on May 27, 1998, which Constitution became effective upon its approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on July 10, 1998; and

WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted amendments to the Constitution on April 26, 2004, which became effective upon approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on May 13, 2004; and

WHEREAS, the legislative powers of the Tribe are vested in the Tribal Council according to Article IV, Section 1 of the Constitution; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is authorized under Article IV, Section 7(a) and (2) to exercise the inherent powers of the Tribe by establishing laws through the enactment of ordinances and adoption of resolutions to govern the conduct of Tribal Members and others within the Tribe's jurisdiction and to promote, protect and provide for the public health, peace, morals, education and general welfare of the Little River Band and its members; and

WHEREAS, there is a well-recognized need to provide emergent services for victims of family violence (and their dependents) as well as a need to prevent incidents of family violence; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS), Administration for Children and Families (ACF), Administration on Children, Youth and Families (ACYF), Family and Youth Service Bureau (FYSB) has extended a formula-driven funding opportunity to tribes in order to: 1) assist tribes in efforts to

provide immediate shelter and supportive services, and 2) assist tribes in family violence prevention efforts; and

WHEREAS, the Tribe is an eligible applicant i.e., Little River Band of Ottawa Indians is a federally-recognized tribal government with a Domestic Violence Program; and

WHEREAS, Little River Band of Ottawa Indians Family Services Department representatives have reviewed this funding opportunity, and recommended that it be pursued in order to help better meet the needs of tribal member victims of family violence; and


WHEREAS, the Tribe's elected leaders hereby concur with the pursuit of these ends in order to improve the social and emotional outcomes of family violence victims.


NOW THEREFORE IT IS RESOLVED, that the Tribal Council of the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians by this resolution approve the submission of the aforementioned formula-based grant application with a full understanding of the assurances and that the funding amount will be determined by the funding agency.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians by this resolution authorizes the Tribal Ogema to execute any and all grant application documents necessary to complete the application prior to the March 15, 2016 deadline.
