Resolution #16-0525-158

Adopting the Amendment to the Government Business and Accounting Act of 2010, Ordinance #10-100-06

- WHEREAS, the status of the *Gaá Čhíng Ziibi Daáwaa Anišhinaábek* (Little River Band of Ottawa Indians) as a sovereign and Treaty-making power is confirmed in numerous treaties, from agreements with the initial colonial powers on this land, to various treaties with the United States; and
- WHEREAS, the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians (Tribe) is descended from, and is the political successor to, the Grand River Ottawa Bands, signatories of the 1836 Treaty of Washington (7 Stat. 491) with the United States, as reaffirmed by federal law in P.L. 103-324, enacted in 1994; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted a new Constitution, pursuant to a vote of the membership on May 27, 1998, which Constitution became effective upon its approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on July 10, 1998; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted amendments to the Constitution on April 26, 2004, which became effective upon approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on May 13, 2004; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is directed under Article IV, Section 7(a) of the Constitution to provide for the public health, peace, morals, education and general welfare of the Little River Band and its members; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is empowered by Article IV, Section 7(a) of the Constitution to establish laws through the enactment of ordinances and adoption of resolutions; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council adopted the Administrative Procedures Act, which identifies the processes by which ordinances may be adopted, amended or repealed, and which also identifies processes by which emergency amendments may be authorized; and
- WHEREAS, the amendment to the Government Business and Accounting Act of 2010 Ordinance were posted for public comment; comments were received; and a final work session was held on May 16, 2016.
- NOW THEREFORE IT IS RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians hereby permanently adopts, under authority of the Administrative

Procedures Act, the following amendment, eliminating the use of the title of director from the Government Business and Accounting Act of 2010, Ordinance #10-100-06:

4.02. Comptroller General.

a. The director of the Government Business and Accounting Office shall be called the Comptroller General. The Comptroller General shall be hired by the Tribal Council and shall be employed at the discretion of the Tribal Council.
