- Approving Tribal Ogema's Execution of Memorandum of Understanding with Women's Information Service, Inc. (WISE), Every Woman's Place (EWP), Center for Women in Transition, and Communities Overcoming Violent Encounters (C.O.V.E)
- WHEREAS, the status of the *Gaá Čhíng Ziíbi Daáwaa Aníšhinaábek* (Little River Band of Ottawa Indians) as a sovereign and Treaty-making power is confirmed in numerous treaties, from agreements with the initial colonial powers on this land, to various treaties with the United States; and
- WHEREAS, the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians (Tribe) is descended from, and is the political successor to, the Grand River Ottawa Bands, signatories of the 1836 Treaty of Washington (7 Stat. 491) with the United States, as reaffirmed by federal law in P.L. 103-324, enacted in 1994; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted a new Constitution, pursuant to a vote of the membership on May 27, 1998, which Constitution became effective upon its approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on July 10, 1998; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted amendments to the Constitution on April 26, 2004, which became effective upon approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on May 13, 2004; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted amendments to the Constitution on July 11, 2016 which became effective upon approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on August 24, 2016; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is authorized under Article IV, Section 7(a) to provide for the public health, peace, morals, education and general welfare of the Little River Band and its members; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is vested with the authority, under Article IV, Section 7(b), to ratify contracts to be entered into by the Tribe; and
- WHEREAS, the executive powers of the Tribe are vested in the Tribal Ogema according to Article V, Section 1 of the Constitution; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Ogema is authorized to consult, negotiate and execute agreements and contracts on behalf of the Little River Band with governments, political subdivisions, and private parties subject to authorization and ratification by Tribal Council.

WHEREAS, the contract has been reviewed, edited and approved by the Unified Legal Department; and

NOW THEREFORE IT IS RESOLVED THAT the Tribal Council of the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians hereby authorizes the Tribal Ogema to Execute the Memorandum Of Understanding with the Victim Services Program through Family Services Department with Women's Information Service, Inc. (WISE), Every Woman's Place (EWP), Center for Women in Transition, and Communities Overcoming Violent Encounters (C.O.V.E.).

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED, that nothing about this memorandum of understanding shall be construed to waive the Tribe's sovereign immunity from any action by any party or private individual, nor shall it operate to create a cause of action against the Tribe.

CERTIFICATE OF ADOPTION
