Resolution #16-1116-353

Authorizing the Donation of \$5,000.00 to the Muskegon Museum of Art and allowing Tribal Logo to be used

- WHEREAS, the status of the *Gaá Čhíng Ziibi Daáwaa Anišhinaábek* (Little River Band of Ottawa Indians) as a sovereign and Treaty-making power is confirmed in numerous treaties, from agreements with the initial colonial powers on this land, to various treaties with the United States; and
- WHEREAS, the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians (Tribe) is descended from, and is the political successor to, the Grand River Ottawa Bands, signatories of the 1836 Treaty of Washington (7 Stat. 491) with the United States, as reaffirmed by federal law in P.L. 103-324, enacted in 1994; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted a new Constitution, pursuant to a vote of the membership on May 27, 1998, which Constitution became effective upon its approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on July 10, 1998; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted amendments to the Constitution on April 26, 2004, which became effective upon approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on May 13, 2004; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted amendments to the Constitution on July 11, 2016, which became effective upon approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on August 24, 2016; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is authorized under Article IV, Section 7(a) to provide for the public health, peace, morals, education and general welfare of the Little River Band and its members; and
- WHEREAS, the Indian Gaming Regulatory Act (IGRA) requires that Indian Tribes that operate gaming operations commit gaming dollars to charitable donations, and the Little River Band's Per Capita Plan has adopted an allocation of gaming dollars to be used as donated funds; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is responsible for determining the recipients of donations for one half of the donated fund reserves, and the Tribal Ogema is responsible for selecting the remainder of recipients, based on the Tribe's approved budget for FY 2015; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has determined that donations to organizations which contribute to the well-being of Tribal Members and the local community are

appropriate for the purposes established by the Revenue Allocation Plan and the restrictions imposed by IGRA; and

WHEREAS, a donation request has been received from the Muskegon Art Museum for the Edward Curtis Exhibit; and

WHEREAS, Tribal Council and Tribal Ogema of the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians recognize the importance of this endeavor;

NOW THEREFORE IT IS RESOLVED THAT the Tribal Council approves the donation of \$5,000 to the Muskegon Art Museum as follows from the donation line:

Tribal Council – 8600-100-5304 \$2,500.00 Tribal Ogema – 8600-102-5304 \$2,500.00

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the Tribal Council directs the Tribal Council's Recorder to prepare a cover letter which is to accompany each donation check to express the Tribe's commitment to supporting valuable community resources.

IT IS FINALLY RESOLVED THAT the Tribal Council allows the Tribal Logo to be used on the advertising and tickets.
