## Resolution #17-0125-020

Authorization of Expenditure to pay 2017 Dues for Membership in the National Indian Gaming Association (NIGA)

- WHEREAS, the status of the Gaá Čhíng Ziíbi Daáwaa Aníšhinaábek (Little River Band of Ottawa Indians) as a sovereign and Treaty-making power is confirmed in numerous treaties, from agreements with the initial colonial powers on this land, to various treaties with the United States; and
- WHEREAS, the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians (Tribe) is descended from, and is the political successor to, the Grand River Ottawa Bands, signatories of the 1836 Treaty of Washington (7 Stat. 491) with the United States, as reaffirmed by federal law in P.L. 103-324, enacted in 1994; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted a new Constitution, pursuant to a vote of the membership on May 27, 1998, which Constitution became effective upon its approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on July 10, 1998; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted amendments to the Constitution on April 26, 2004, which became effective upon approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on May 13, 2004; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is authorized under Article IV, Section 7(a) to provide for the public health, peace, morals, education and general welfare of the Little River Band and its members; and
- WHEREAS, the primary purposes of NIGA are to promote, protect and preserve the general welfare and interest of gaming Tribes through the development of sound policies and practices with respect to the conduct of gaming in Indian Country, to assist in the dissemination of information to the Indian gaming community, the federal government and the general public on issues related to Indian gaming, to preserve and protect the integrity of gaming in Indian Country, and to maintain, protect and advocate Indian Tribal sovereignty; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has determined that membership in the National Indian Gaming Association has been beneficial, and will continue to be beneficial, to the Tribe in providing information, resources and training; and

NOW THEREFORE IT IS RESOLVED THAT the Tribal Council of the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians hereby authorizes the payment of \$25,000 membership dues for 2017 membership in the National Indian Gaming Association from the Ogema Budget #1010-102-5302

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the Delegate and Alternate Delegate designations shall continue for so long as the delegated shall hold office as Ogema or members of the Tribal Council.
