Resolution in Support of the W.K. Kellogg Eye Center from the University of Michigan's Grant Application to the Serva Foundation to study the Michigan Native American for development of tele-health services needs

- WHEREAS, the status of the *Gaá Čhíng Ziibi Daáwaa Anišhinaábek* (Little River Band of Ottawa Indians) as a sovereign and Treaty-making power is confirmed in numerous treaties, from agreements with the initial colonial powers on this land, to various treaties with the United States; and
- WHEREAS, the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians (Tribe) is descended from, and is the political successor to, the Grand River Ottawa Bands, signatories of the 1836 Treaty of Washington (7 Stat. 491) with the United States, as reaffirmed by federal law in P.L. 103-324, enacted in 1994; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted a new Constitution, pursuant to a vote of the membership on May 27, 1998, which Constitution became effective upon its approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on July 10, 1998; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted amendments to the Constitution on April 26, 2004, which became effective upon approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on May 13, 2004; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted amendments to the Constitution on July 11, 2016 which became effective upon approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on August 24, 2016; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is authorized under Article IV, Section 7(a) of the Constitution to provide for the public health, peace, morals and education and general welfare of the Little River Band and its members; and
- WHEREAS, Tribal Council is committed to the welfare, care, and protection of Tribal Members and recognize the importance of the Eye Care Study; and
- WHEREAS, Tribal Council is in support of this study for Native American Eye Care Services needs; and

NOW THEREFORE IT IS RESOLVED that the Tribal Council hereby submits this resolution in support of the W.K. Kellogg Eye Center's Grant Application to the Serva Foundation to study the eye care needs of Native American Michiganders.

Dear Joseph,

The W.K. Kellogg Eye Center at the University of Michigan is developing an eHealth program. Kellogg's eHealth services provide a way for underserved patients to receive essential care without traveling to the ophthalmologist's office. eHealth programs to date focus on ways to screen and monitor diabetic eye disease, glaucoma, cataracts, corneal infection, retinopathy of prematurity, and macular degeneration. No specific programs within Kellogg's eHealth portfolio currently target Native Americans. However, with the knowledge gained by a grant we are applying for, we can study how services could be developed in ways best meeting local needs. The grant is sought from the Seva Foundation, an organization which since 1978 has been a leading innovator in the delivery of vital eye care services to the world's most vulnerable people.

The level and type of resources necessary to make programs work in Native American communities or distributed wherever Native Americans reside within Michigan is an important part of the proposed assessment. Some tele-ophthalmology programs can be carried out by patients; others depend on the use of trained local personnel. As fully as possible, it is our intent to augment and build upon existing structures rather than create unneeded new or wasteful ones. The liaison effort with local tribes and others will be a key part in assuring that this occurs.

Can we ask for your support for our grant application by returning this email with some minimal information? No obligations are involved in signifying your support; it just allows us to make the grant application.
