Apply to the Administration for Children and Families (ACF) for an American Rescue Plan Act Emergency Native Language formula fund grant

- WHEREAS, the status of the *Gaá Čhíng Ziibi Daáwaa Anišhinaábek* (Little River Band of Ottawa Indians) as a sovereign and Treaty-making power is confirmed in numerous treaties, from agreements with the initial colonial powers on this land, to various treaties with the United States; and
- WHEREAS, the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians (Tribe) is descended from, and is the political successor to, the Grand River Ottawa Bands, signatories of the 1836 Treaty of Washington (7 Stat. 491) with the United States, as reaffirmed by federal law in P.L. 103-324, enacted in 1994; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted a new Constitution, pursuant to a vote of the membership on May 27, 1998, which Constitution became effective upon its approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on July 10, 1998; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted amendments to the Constitution on April 26, 2004, which became effective upon approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on May 13, 2004; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted amendments to the Constitution on July 11, 2016 which became effective upon approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on August 24, 2016; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is authorized under Article IV, Section 7(a) to provide for the public health, peace, morals, education and general welfare of the Little River Band and its members; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is vested with the authority, under Article IV, Section 7(b), to ratify contracts to be entered into by the Tribe; and
- WHEREAS, Tribe Council supports the need of an updated and enhanced language tutorial and practice application that members can access on any device during COVID19 or other pandemic like occurrence; and
- WHEREAS, the Administration for Children and Families (ACF) is providing American Rescue Plan Act Emergency Native Language formula funding that will be made available to all tribes that submit a qualified language preservation project; and

- WHEREAS, the AFC, ARP formula fund language preservation grant will range from \$38,000 to \$95,000 depending upon the number of qualified submitted tribal language project applications; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe has a proposal from Brick House Interactive to update and consolidate LRBOI's electronic language resources through creation of a webbased application, making them accessible to members on any device for the sum of \$93,940; and
- WHEREAS, in order to cover the remaining cost of the project, either Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act or American Rescue Plan (ARP) Act funding, not to exceed \$56,000, will be used toward the proposed language preservation project describe above to promote remote learning during COVID19 pandemic scenarios; and
- NOW THEREFORE IT IS RESOLVED, Tribal Council approves application to the Administration for Children and Families (ACF) for an American Rescue Plan Act Emergency Native Language formula fund grant
